The mission of Currey Ingram Academy is to provide an exemplary K-12 day school program that empowers students with learning differences to achieve their fullest potential.

The school delivers on its mission by providing:

- Evidence-based instruction
- Individualized learning plans for every student

- Speech-language and academic occupational therapies
- Character education and social coaching
- Personalized college preparation and counseling

Enrollment

300 students in K-12 represent:

- 7 counties
- 33 states

Why do families choose us

- Their children are recognized for their strengths and talents and feel proud of their accomplishments.
- Their children learn in an environment that uses evidence-based curriculum that includes multisensory lessons and success strategies based on their learning styles.
- Their children find social and academic success through daily work on social skills, character education, leadership development, and organizational skills.
- Their children receive appropriately challenging individualized instruction that offers exploratory activities in the lower and middle schools and a liberal arts, college-preparatory curriculum in the upper school.
- Their children learn to establish a strong work ethic and to advocate for their needs.

Arts, athletics and extacurriculars

- Strong placement-based, no-cut athletics program for grades 5-12 that is designed for both beginners and skilled athletics. It emphasizes character development, teamwork, and life skills and offers a variety of choices in both team and individual sports.
- Full complement of theatre, music, and visual arts programs for all grades.
- Strong after-care programs and clubs for lower school and middle school students.
- Variety of social opportunities, including but not limited to field trips, class trips, dances, pep rallies, all-school bandfests, all-school campout, spirit week, homecoming, and prom. (Opportunities vary based on grade levels.)

Approximately \$1.75 million will be awarded to about 35 percent of the student body for the 2017-18 school year.

Founding

- 1968 as Westminster School of Nashville
- 2002 renamed to Currey Ingram Academy and moved to current location

Community outreach

- Annette Eskind Institute of Learning offers sessions on a variety of topics to help participants better understand child and adolescent development and how children learn
- Summer Camp program offers seven weeks of full-day camp experiences for students in rising grades K-6, with select opportunities for older campers. In addition, we offer an intensive six-week summer treatment program for students with ADHD. The program is designed like a day camp for students ages 8 to 12.
